The *Future IDs at Alcatraz* Release Party will weave the personal narratives of the exhibition's artists with the many stories of human resilience encapsulated on Alcatraz over time. There will be a variety of first-hand accounts by people who have felt the direct impact of incarceration and are now using their experiences to improve their own lives and the lives of others. Programs will also consider the far-reaching effects of incarceration on families and communities. Invited participants include returning citizens who lead arts programs on the "outside" in discussion with California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation leadership about the value of art programming "inside," and a devised workshop/performance led by alumni from The [Actors' Gang Prison Project](#).

Future IDs at Alcatraz is a yearlong exhibition and series of community programs featuring ID-inspired artworks created by and with individuals who have conviction histories as they conceive and develop a vision for a future self.

Artist [Gregory Sale](#) and collaborators have translated criminal justice reform efforts into a visual language. Dr. Luis Garcia, Kirn Kim, Sabrina Reid, Jessica Tully, Sale and many others have designed the project to function as a platform for community engagement.

Future IDs at Alcatraz is now open daily 10am to 4pm and runs through October 2019 and is presented in partnership with the [Art in the Parks](#) program of the National Park Service and the Golden Gate National Parks Conservancy.

It began through a relationship with the Anti-Recidivism Coalition and has grown into a multi-layered initiative involving more than 20 community organizations.
